**Sub: Recruitment of Scheduled Tribes in Delhi Police: News Item titled "Delhi Police steps out of capital for recruitment" published in the Times of India (New Delhi Edition) dated 23/08/2013**

Sir,

The Commission has noted from the News Item titled "Delhi Police steps out of capital for recruitment" published in the Times of India (New Delhi Edition) dated 23/08/2013 that the Delhi Police has undertaken recruitment for various posts including 1434 posts reserved for women (STs etc.) from 8 States, which do not include States like Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa etc.-predominantly inhabited by the Scheduled Tribes. The Commission is of the view that the priority is required to be accorded for recruitment from these States, especially considering the large scale of migration taking place from these States to Delhi. Hence, the reasons for exclusion of these States for the planned recruitment are not understood.

Dr. Rameshwar Oraon, Chairperson, National Commission for Scheduled Tribes has desired to discuss the matter regarding recruitment of Scheduled Tribes from the States mentioned above with you in the **meeting scheduled to be held on 2/09/2013 at 1230 hrs. in his Chamber**.
